WHAT IS A COLLEGE?

Sounds like a silly question but some people aren't sure as teachers don't talk much about College in Schools

Colleges like Lincoln and Newark College are places where you can learn practical skills for work as part of qualifications like BTECs, as well as more traditional qualifications like A Levels and now the new T Levels.

We call our teachers lecturers and lots of them have worked in the industry they teach for many years. Even our A Levels lecturers tend to have more industry experience than in most Schools.

Many of our students progress from their level two and three courses into apprenticeships, where they are employed by a company while they continue to learn new skills and gain higher qualifications. Others progress on to University as our practical qualifications and the new T Levels are the equivalent of A Levels and gain you UCAS points to go to University if you want to.

Perhaps the most important thing you need to know is that this is an equally valuable route into your chosen career as Sixth Forms and universities. In fact, many of our students go on to earn really good money in stable careers quicker than young people who take the more traditional route.

So, College is right for some people and Sixth Form is right for others, but don't feel pressured into picking one over the other by the people around you. 


GCSES DONE: NOW WHAT?

There are lots of options open to you after your exams – all are valid and all can lead to a great career – it's just about finding the right fit for you Your main choices are between A Levels, technical training qualifications for trades like BTECs, technical qualifications that include an industry placement, which are called T Levels, and apprenticeships.

It's really important to point out that none of these pathways cancel each other out. For example, you don't have to do A Levels to get to University. Many of our students complete Level 2 and Level 3 technical qualifications and then then go to University as technical qualifications carry UCAS points in the same way A Levels do. Although apprenticeships don't carry UCAS points unless they include a technical qualification, you can do a foundation course for a year and then progress to University. We deliver all of these different types of courses and we also offer a wide range of degree courses at Lincoln College. If you progress onto one of our degree courses we also offer an amazing £1,000 cashback deal at the end of the first year of your degree course.

If you want to get into work sooner, then technical qualifications are probably the right choice for you. Many of our learners end up earning good money in their career of choice faster than friends that went to University.



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STUDYING APPRENTICESHIPS

Apprenticeships are a great way to get on the career ladder, so you can start earning cash while you train and gain your independence quicker

They're also a cost effective way to change your career later in life enabling you to cover the bills while you retrain.

If you've taken time out to raise children or for health reasons, they enable you to refresh your expertise in your career of choice.

And they're not just for new starters to a company. If you're already in a career you love for a firm you're happy with, but want to move to the next level, they're a cost-effective way to enable your company to elevate you - just talk to your boss about it.

It's true that apprenticeships are a great way for 16-18-year-olds to learn a trade, but one of the most common misconceptions is that's all there is to them. Higher and Degree Apprenticeships can be a way for a senior managers to learn the skills they need to progress to the peak of their careers.

The first step is to find an apprenticeship vacancy (similar to a job vacancy) with a local firm. You apply just like you would for a job, but don't worry, our team will help you every step of the way – even helping you to write your CV and coaching you for your interview.

You can even start applying for these over the summer in your final year of GCSEs.

What about if I'm in my final year at School?

You can start looking at our website for apprenticeship vacancies during your final term and over the Summer – we'll do our best to help you secure an apprenticeship job by September. When you leave School you must be in full time education or an apprenticeship until the age of 18, so in case you don't secure an apprenticeship job, we advise all of our School Leavers to apply for a full time course in a related subject as well. On our application we ask you if you want to be an apprentice and if you tick this box we help you search for an apprenticeship while you're on your course and you can transfer as soon as you find one.



The A Level pathway is designed for 16-18 year olds wishing to study full time and progress to higher education or employment. You need to apply to one of the A Levels you are interested in. On the application form it will ask you to enter the other A Levels you would like to apply for.

Our experienced subject specialists make supporting you in your learning journey a priority. You will study 3 subjects, with lessons across the week, and be part of a group tutorial alongside other students with similar interests to yourself. As well as gaining academic support from each of your subject teachers, you will be assigned a Progress Coach to guide you in applications to higher education and support your progress. There are 17 subject choices which can be chosen in any combination of 3. For many subjects you will take the AS Level in the first year, giving you valuable examination practice and UCAS points, before moving on to the full A Level in the second year. For those subjects described as linear you will study the full two year A Level only.

STUDYING T LEVELS

T Levels are a new, 2-year qualification designed to give you a head start towards the career you want. The government has developed T Levels to deliver world class technical education and give you a new choice after GCSEs

About T Levels

- T Levels are a brand new, 2 year qualification that you can do as an alternative to A Levels, other post 16 courses or an apprenticeship. They bring classroom learning and an extended industry placement together on a course designed with businesses and employers.
- T Levels are ideal if you have finished your GCSEs and want the knowledge and experience to get straight into employment, an apprenticeship or higher education. You'll spend 80% of your time in the classroom and 20% on a 45 day placement with an employer to give you the skills and knowledge companies look for.
- One T Level takes 2 years of full time study and is equivalent to 3 A Levels.

The first 3 T Levels have started at selected Colleges and Schools in England, with more coming in the following years.

Why choose T Levels?

A T Level is a nationally recognised qualification that is worth the same number of UCAS points as 3 A Levels.

Endorsed by business, they include a 45-day industry placement to help you learn what a real career is like.

Created with businesses

T Levels have been designed with leading businesses and employers to give you the knowledge and skills you need. More than 200 businesses – including Fujitsu and Skanska – have been involved so you can be confident your T Level will move you to the next level.

- Get ahead in your career
 T Levels give you the chance to learn what a real career is like while you continue your studies. Your industry placement will last for at least 45 days.
- Qualifications that count When you pass your T Level, you will get a nationally recognised certificate showing the overall grade you achieved - pass, merit, distinction or distinction*. It will also give details of what you learned on the course to help you move into skilled employment or a higher apprenticeship.
- Awarded UCAS points

Your T Level will be worth UCAS points – a T Level Distinction* is worth the same as 3 A Levels at A* – and will be recognised by universities and other education providers so you can choose to continue studying if you wish.

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
