Perhaps the most important thing you need to know is that this is an equally valuable route into your chosen career as Sixth Forms and Universities. In fact, many of our students go on to earn really good money in stable careers quicker than young people who take the more traditional route.



There are lots of options open to you after your exams – all are valid and all can lead to a great career – it's just about finding the right fit for you.

Your main choices are A Levels, Technical Training, T Levels and Apprenticeships.

It's really important to point out that none of these pathways cancel each other out. For example, you don't have to do A Levels to get to University. Many of our students complete Level 2 and Level 3 technical qualifications and then go to University - as technical qualifications also carry UCAS points the same as A Levels do. Apprenticeships don't carry UCAS points (unless it includes a technical qualification) - however, you can do a foundation course for a year and then progress to University.

We deliver all of these different types of courses, including a wide range of degree courses at Lincoln College. If you progress onto one of our degree courses, at the end of the first year, you will receive our fantastic £1,000 cashback deal.

If you want to get into work sooner, then technical qualifications are probably the right choice for you! Many of our learners earn good money in their career of choice faster than friends that went to University.

- Policing students and lecturers were interviewed by BBC Radio Lincolnshire about their curriculum enrichment trip to the Lincolnshire Police control room where they saw first-hand how everything operates and the varied roles available beyond College.
- Students split into groups with team leaders and call signs assigned in the debrief. After a risk assessment, they searched the crime scene on-site at Deans Park. Tasked to identify suspicious items, record on logs and call control via radios using grid references. Crime scene investigators then collected forensics and DNA to give students an enriching experience in life as an officer.



STUDYING A LEVELS

We have a great range of A Level subjects, from which you need to choose three subjects

The A Level pathway is designed for 16-18 year olds wishing to study full time and progress to Higher Education or employment. You need to apply to one of the A Levels you are interested in. On the application form it will ask you to enter the other A Levels you would like to apply for.



Our experienced subject specialists make supporting you in your learning journey a priority. You will study 3 subjects, with lessons across the week, and be part of a group tutorial alongside other students with similar interests to yourself. As well as gaining academic support from each of your subject teachers, you will be assigned a Progress Coach to guide you in applications to Higher Education and support your progress. There are 17 subject choices which can be chosen in any combination of 3. For many subjects you will take the AS Level in the first year, giving you valuable examination practice and UCAS points, before moving on to the full A Level in the second year. For those subjects described as linear you will study the full two year A Level only.

STUDYING T LEVELS

T Levels are a new, 2 year qualification designed to give you a head start towards the career you want. The government has developed T Levels to deliver world class technical education and give you a new choice after GCSEs

About T Levels

- T Levels are a brand new, 2 year qualification that you can do as an alternative to A Levels, other post 16 courses or an apprenticeship. They bring classroom learning and an extended industry placement together on a course designed with businesses and employers.
- T Levels are ideal if you have finished your GCSEs and want the knowledge and experience to get straight into employment, an apprenticeship or Higher Education. You'll spend 80% of your time in the classroom and 20% on a 45 day placement with an employer to give you the skills and knowledge companies look for.

Why choose T Levels?

A T Level is a nationally recognised qualification that is worth the same number of UCAS points as 3 A Levels.

Endorsed by businesses, they include a 45 day industry placement to help you learn what a real career is like.

■ T Level students will have an extra hour in their weekly schedule for EEP sessions (employment, enrichment, pastoral) throughout year 1 and 2 to develop their employability skills further. Students will also have an employer project which combines observations on industry placements and theoretical knowledge acquired from classes.

Created with businesses

T Levels have been designed with leading businesses and employers to give you the knowledge and skills you need to get ahead in your career. More than 200 businesses - including Fujitsu and Skanska have been involved so you can be confident your T Level will move you to the next level.

Qualifications that count

When you pass your T Level, you will get a nationally recognised certificate showing the overall grade you achieved - pass, merit, distinction or distinction*. It will also give details of what you learned on the course to help you move into skilled employment or a higher apprenticeship.



Your T Level will be worth UCAS points - a T Level Distinction* is worth the same as 3 A Levels at A* – and will be recognised by Universities and other education providers so you can choose to continue studying if you wish.

Like A Levels, there are no tuition fees to study a T Level if you start before you are 19. Schools and Colleges set their own entry requirements, so check their website or contact them direct to find out more.

ZOE ROBINSON TLEVELS

Zoe Robinson is a first-year T Level Health and Science student and one of the first cohorts at Lincoln College to undertake the T Level qualification. Zoe will be heading into second year in September 2023.

Zoe Robinson, "The course has been good so far. We have had a very eclectic experience - from in the classroom with teachers to being in the hospital with different professionals. With it being a new course, I wasn't sure what it would be like, but I like it - you also get a reallife view of what you want to do.

Within the course, we had a 45 day placement at Lincoln County Hospital. You see different areas of the hospital gaining respect for what they do and see how departments run within the hospital. I was in and out of wards a lot, it is fast-paced. I got to see the MRIs, X-rays, dressing changes, equipment

operation and helped out with stamping paperwork and cleaning.

The course helped set in my mind what I want to do in the future - during the placement, it can give you an idea of workplace expectations and whether you can handle them. Next year, I will be specialising in Adult Nursing. I am excited we have high-tech dolls and sensory rooms at College - set like a hospital where we can do realistic scenarios – you can talk to the dolls like patients, give them the medicine, and then the dolls respond to the medication like a person would."

Apprenticeships are a great way to get on the career ladder, so you can start earning cash while you train and gain your independence quicker

They're also a cost effective way to change your career later in life enabling you to cover the bills while you retrain.

If you've taken time out to raise children or for health reasons, they enable you to refresh your expertise in your career of choice.

And they're not just for new starters to a company. If you're already in a career you love for a firm you're happy with, but want to move to the next level, they're a cost-effective way to enable your company to elevate you - just talk to your boss about it.

It's true that apprenticeships are a great way for 16-18-year-olds to learn a trade, but one of the most common misconceptions is that's all there is to them.

Higher and Degree Apprenticeships can be a way for a senior managers to learn the skills they need to progress to the peak of their careers.

The first step is to find an apprenticeship vacancy (similar to a job vacancy) with a local firm. You apply just like you would for a job, but don't worry, our team will help you every step of the way – even helping you to write your CV and coaching you for your interview.

You can even start applying for these over the summer in your final year of GCSEs.

What about if I'm in my final year at School?

You can start looking at our website for apprenticeship vacancies during your final term and over the Summer – we'll do our best to help you secure an apprenticeship job by September.

When you leave School you must be in full time education or an apprenticeship until the age of 18, so in case you don't secure an apprenticeship job, we advise all of our School Leavers to apply for a full time course in a related subject as well. On our application we ask you if you want to be an apprentice and if you tick this box we help you search for an apprenticeship while you're on your course and you can transfer as soon as you find one.






The free driving lessons scheme is open to all students completing an industry placement relevant to their level two or three courses*
