To achieve the Level 2 Extended Certificate in Health and Social Care Professions (601/6239/9), learners must achieve a minimum of 25 credits, with a minimum of 7 credits from the Personal and Social Development optional units and a minimum of 18 credits from the Health and Social Care optional units. At least 13 credits must be at Level 2.
