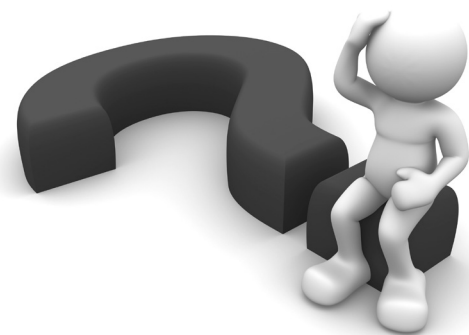


Working with Individuals with Learning Disabilities
