WHAT IS A COLLEGE?

It sounds like a silly question, but some people aren't sure as teachers don't talk much about College in Schools

Colleges like Lincoln College, Newark College and the Air & Space Institute (ASI) are places where you can learn practical skills for work as part of qualifications like BTECs, as well as more traditional qualifications like A Levels and now the new T Levels.

At College, we call our teachers 'lecturers', and many of them have worked in the industry they teach for many years. Even our A level lecturers tend to have more industry experience than teachers in most schools.

Many of our students progress from their level two and three courses into apprenticeships, where they are employed by a company while they continue to learn new skills and gain higher qualifications.

A number of our students often progress to university, as our practical qualifications and the new T Levels are the equivalent of A Levels and gain you UCAS points to go to University if you want to.

Perhaps the most important thing you need to know is that this is an equally valuable route into your chosen career as Sixth Forms and Universities.

In fact, a lot of our students go on to earn really good money in stable careers more quickly than young people who take the more traditional route.

So, College is right for some people and Sixth Form is right for others, but don't feel pressured into picking one over the other by the people around you.

Take your time, read our student guides like this one, make sure you visit all of the places you are considering, and make the right choice for you.

GCSES DONE: NOW WHAT?

There are lots of options open to you after your exams – all are valid and all can lead to a great career – it's just about finding the right fit for you.

Didn't quite get the grades you were hoping for?

Don't worry - we will support you in obtaining your goals or finding a path that suits your situation to kick-start your further education journey. It is very common for students to not achieve the desired GCSE English and/or Maths grades.

For these students, we offer Level 1 or 2 programmes alongside opportunities to resit their English and/or Maths exams. Once the necessary grades have been achieved, progression opportunities to more specialised Level 3 programmes become available. Rest assured, we will get you there!

University Progression

Your main choices are A Levels, Technical Training, Specialist Programmes, T Levels, Supported Education and Apprenticeships. It's important to point out that none of these pathways cancel each other out. For example, you don't need to complete A Levels to enter university. Many of our students complete Level 2 and Level 3 technical qualifications and then proceed to university, as they also carry UCAS points, like A Levels.

While Apprenticeships typically do not carry UCAS points unless they include a technical qualification, it is possible to undertake a foundation course for a year and then progress to university.

Straight into employment

If your goal is to enter the workforce sooner, technical qualifications might be the right choice for you. Many of our learners find themselves earning a good income in their chosen careers faster than their peers who opted for university.

STUDYING A LEVELS

We have a great range of A Level subjects, from which you need to choose three subjects

The A Level pathway is designed for 16-18 year olds wishing to study full time and progress to Higher Education or employment. You need to apply to one of the A Levels you are interested in. On the application form it will ask you to enter the other A Levels you would like to apply for.

Our experienced subject specialists make supporting you in your learning journey a priority. You will study 3 subjects, with lessons across the week, and be part of a group tutorial alongside other students with similar interests to yourself. As well as gaining academic support from each of your subject teachers, you will be assigned a Progress Coach to guide you in applications to Higher Education and support your progress.

There are 22 subject choices which can be chosen in any combination of 3. For many subjects you will take the AS Level in the first year, giving you valuable examination practice and UCAS points, before moving on to the full A Level in the second year. About T Levels

- T Levels are a brand new, 2 year qualification that you can do as an alternative to A Levels, other post 16 courses or an apprenticeship. They bring classroom learning and an extended industry placement together on a course designed with businesses and employers.
- T Levels are ideal if you have finished your GCSEs and want the knowledge and experience to get straight into employment, an apprenticeship or Higher Education. You'll spend 80% of your time in the classroom and 20% on a 45 day placement with an employer to give you the skills and knowledge companies look for.

Why choose T Levels?

A T Level is a nationally recognised qualification that is worth the same number of UCAS points as 3 A Levels.

Endorsed by businesses, they include a 45 day industry placement to help you learn what a real career is like.

- T Level students will have an extra hour in their weekly schedule for EEP sessions (employment, enrichment, pastoral) throughout year 1 and 2 to develop their employability skills further. Students will also have an employer project which combines observations on industry placements and theoretical knowledge acquired from classes.

- **Created with businesses**
T Levels have been designed with leading businesses and employers to give you the knowledge and skills you need to get ahead in your career. More than 200 businesses – including Fujitsu and Skanska – have been involved so you can be confident your T Level will move you to the next level.

Ellie branched out into new territory by completing the Introductory Diploma in Hospitality and Tourism in 2021. Her curiosity and enthusiasm for exploring different industries eventually led her to the Art and Design department, where she discovered her passion for photography.

In 2022, Ellie enrolled on the Level 2 Photography programme and excelled, achieving a Merit in her Final Major Project. She continues to push the boundaries in her photography, having previously created sustainability-driven work for her Level 2 exhibition, *Cleaning Up Our Act*. Ellie is admired for her drive, openness to feedback, and her role as a student representative.

STUDYING APPRENTICESHIPS

Apprenticeships are a great way to get on the career ladder, so you can start earning cash while you train and gain your independence quicker

An apprenticeship is a paid job where you gain valuable skills and experiences. Alongside on-the-job training, apprentices must spend time each week completing off the job training in accordance with the Apprenticeship Standard.

What is an Apprenticeship?

An Apprenticeship lasts for at least 8 months and combines hands-on work with the opportunity to train and obtain qualifications. It's also a paid position, so you earn while you learn. Apprentices spend at least six hours per week in classroom-based or workplace learning with the College, while the rest of their time is spent applying their skills in the workplace.

An Apprenticeship includes:

- Earning a wage and getting holiday pay
- Working alongside experienced staff
- Gaining job-specific skills
- Getting hands-on experience in a sector/role of interest
- Allocated time for training and study related to your role (at least six hours per week of your normal working hours)
- Developing your English and Maths skills as needed
- Formal assessment leading to a nationally recognised qualification

Apprenticeships are a cost-effective way to change careers later in life, allowing you to cover bills while retraining. If you've taken time out to raise children or for health reasons, apprenticeships can help you refresh your expertise. They're also not just for new starters. If you're in a career you love and want to advance, apprenticeships can help your company elevate you—just talk to your boss.

Apprenticeships are great for 16-18-year-olds to learn a trade, but they also offer opportunities for senior managers through Higher and Degree Apprenticeships to gain skills needed to progress further.

The first step is finding an apprenticeship vacancy with a local company. Apply as you would for a job, and our team will help you with every step, from writing your CV to interview coaching. You can start applying over the summer in your final year of GCSEs.

What about if I'm in my final year at School?

Start looking at our website for apprenticeship vacancies during your final term and over the summer – we'll help you secure an apprenticeship by September. As you must be in full time education or on an apprenticeship until 18, we advise school leavers to also apply for a full time course in a related subject. If you indicate interest in an apprenticeship on your application, we'll help you search for one while you're on your course, allowing you to transfer as soon as you find a suitable position.

Charlotte Busby, a 19-year-old first-year Level 3 Automotive Apprentice, has a passion for working on motorbikes and is determined to pursue a career in the automotive industry.

However, finding an apprenticeship proved to be more difficult than she had anticipated.

Charlotte explains: "I've always wanted to work on motorbikes, but I couldn't find any placements or apprenticeships near my home in Gainsborough. Whenever I applied, I was either ignored, or the responses led nowhere. I was almost ready to give up when I heard back from Colin at Prentice Autocare. He offered me a two-day trial, and I absolutely loved it. All that was left to do was find a college, which Colin kindly arranged for me."

Colin, the owner of Prentice Autocare, a motor workshop offering MOTs, services, and repairs, saw potential in Charlotte's application. With a vacancy available, inviting her for an interview was an easy decision.

Colin commented: "I was looking for someone who had a genuine interest in cars, and Charlotte stood out straight away. We were also pleased that Lincoln College agreed to take her on, despite us being outside of their usual catchment area. The support we've received from Lincoln College has been excellent - it's been a night-and-day difference compared to other colleges we've worked with."

Charlotte is now working towards becoming a Level 3 qualified Motor Vehicle Service and Maintenance Technician, which will take three years unless she completes it earlier. Colin adds, "Charlotte has thrown herself into the role from day one.

She's already undertaken a variety of tasks to a high standard, such as changing brake pads and wheels under supervision. She's also assisted with more complex jobs, including putting a new chain on a car that came in with an oil leak. She asks great questions and is always eager to learn - it's great to have someone with that attitude on the team."

Charlotte's journey to becoming a fully qualified technician is just beginning, but with her determination, passion, and support from both Prentice Autocare and Lincoln College, she is well on her way to achieving her goals.

The Drill came alive with a Hollywood theme this year, with performances from Dance students as well as solo performances from singers and Level 3 Performing Arts students. Despite needing surgery in 2021 that disrupted his studies, Jake returned to complete Level 2 Plumbing by December 2023. Throughout, he made remarkable progress in his social and communication skills, gaining confidence, securing full time plumbing employment, and passing his driving test.

GLOBAL ADVENTURES ENRICHING COLLEGE LIFE

Thanks to the Turing Scheme, students from a wide range of academic backgrounds at college are getting the chance to expand their horizons with incredible trips abroad - combining education with unforgettable cultural experiences. Each trip not only enhances course content but opens up a whole world of new perspectives.

Students from the Air and Space Institute (ASI) recently travelled to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, where they are taking part in a hands-on practical activity alongside students at ITQAN. Their visit included a weekend desert camp and the chance to savour traditional Saudi meals - including camel lasagne. One of the highlights of the trip was celebrating Saudi Founding Day - a national holiday rich in cultural festivities.

In Germany, six Level 2 Education and Childcare students from the Lincoln and Newark campuses embarked on a two-week trip to Lüdinghausen. The learners completed work experience placements in three local nurseries and had the opportunity to experience student life at Richard von Weizsäcker College. It was a fantastic way to combine practical training with international exposure.

Meanwhile, adventurous A Level students travelled to Norway, where they fully immersed themselves in the local culture - quite literally - by taking an ice dip in -13°C waters, followed by a traditional sauna! During their visit to Sørumsand Academy, students enjoyed engaging lessons on the First World War and explored Scandinavian influences on the English language. 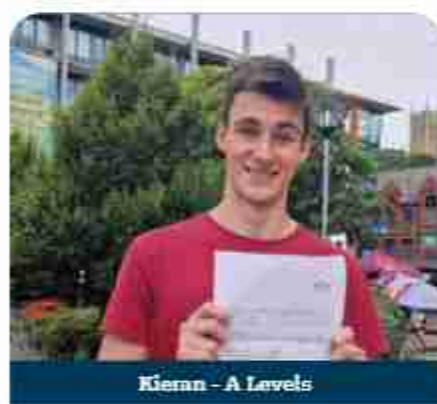

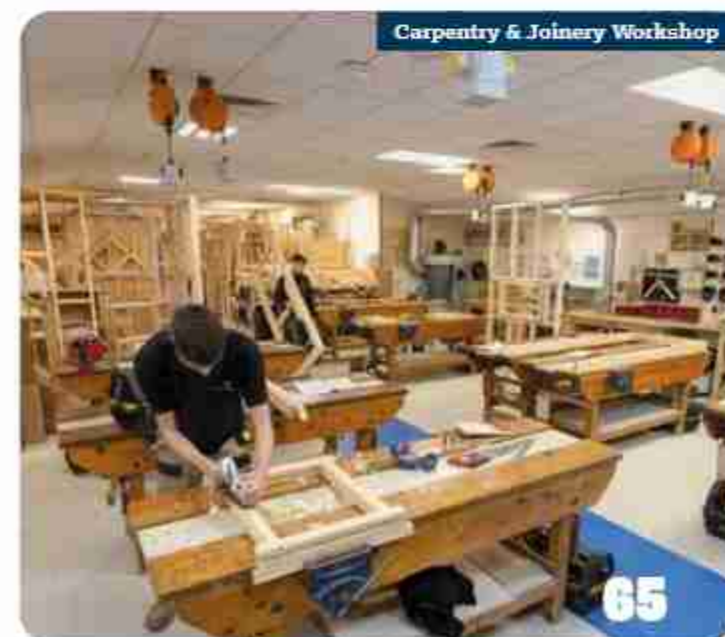

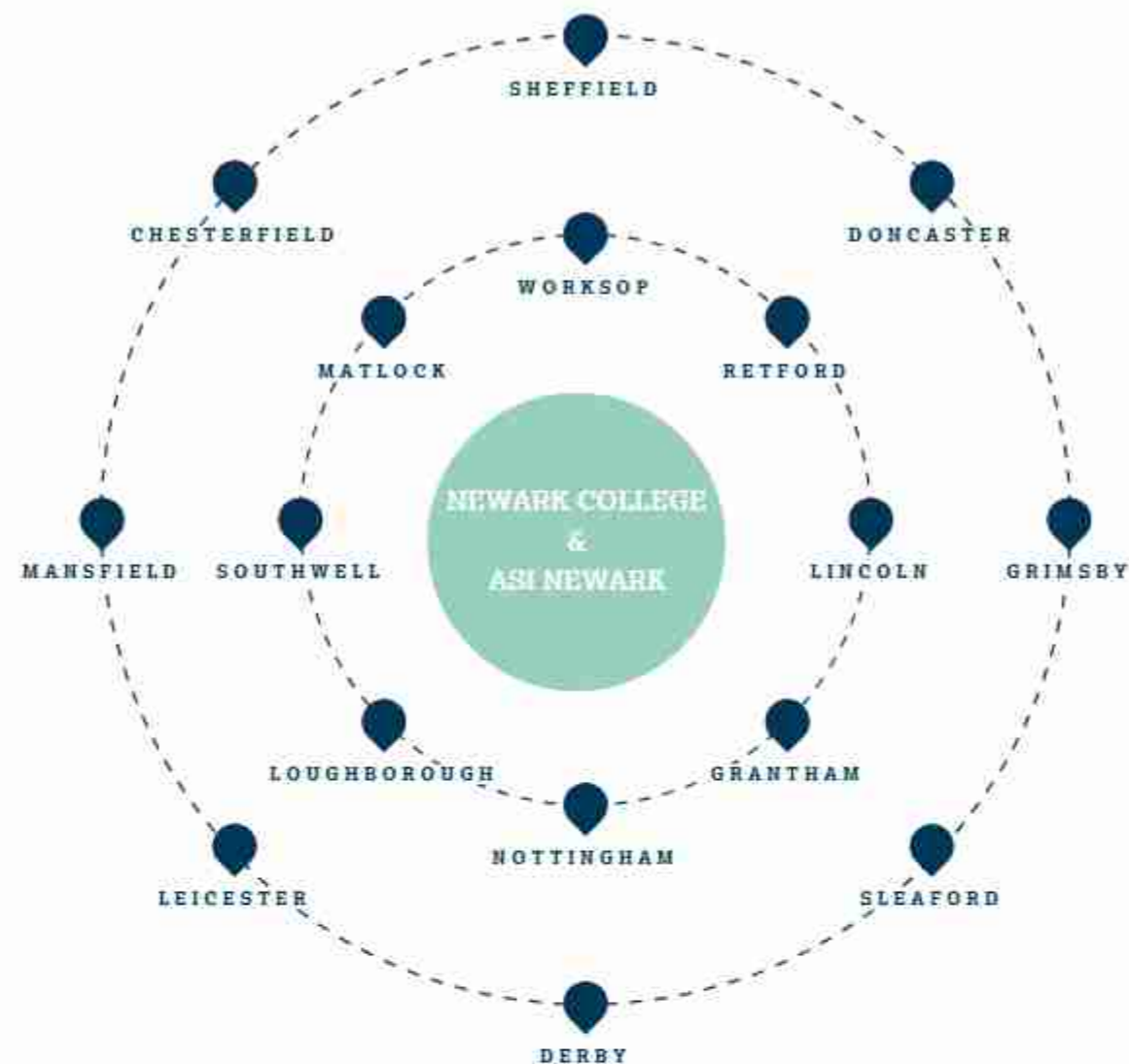
